





<p>Light is used as a metaphor to describe Jesus and his impact on the world.</p> <p>Christians believe the light of Jesus brings hope in dark places. Driedel	A four-sided spinning top, played during the Jewish holiday of Hanukkah.		
Saviour	Someone who rescues or saves people from danger or destruction.		
Incarnation	The doctrine that Jesus Christ is the embodiment of God in man.		
Hanukkah	A Jewish festival that runs for eight days in December in which a special candle is lit each night.		
Temple	A building or place where a god or gods are worshiped.
