Year 3 Scheme of Work

Term: Autumn 2

Topic: PSHE

Key Skills and Knowledge:

Celebrating Difference

- I can tell you about a conflict that I have witnessed or been involved with.
- I can tell you how a conflict that I seen or been involved with made me feel.
- I can describe different conflicts that might happen in a family or friendship groups and how words can be used in hurtful or kind ways when conflicts happen.
- I can tell you how being involved with a conflict makes me feel and can offer strategies to help the situation e.g. Solve it together or asking for help.
- I can explain when my involvement with conflict situations affected other people's feelings and why this made situations better or worse. I can explain the effect this had on relationships.
- I can explain how the role of a witness in a conflict situation can be helpful/ unhelpful depending on their actions. I can suggest ways that I might act in these situations.

Reading and Writing Opportunities (Long and Short Activities)

Creative Ideas and Hooks

- Children look at photos of different types of families. They identify what they all have in common e.g. safe, loving. They draw and label their own family members. They identify what their family means to them.
- Read conflict scenarios and identify how they would use the solve-it together technique in each one.
- Listen to a story about bullying. Write about ways they could help someone who is being bullied.
- Discuss if different scenarios are bullying or not bullying and why/ why not? Use sole-it together technique to solve issues.

Links to PSHCE, Equality and British Values Work

Individual liberty - Children are shown they should be happy with their differences and other peoples.
 Mutual respect – Different types of families but they all offer the same loving environment/ resolving conflict in a respectful way.
 Democracy – Children feel happy in their choices and differences.
 Rule of law – Discussion of the correct use of the word 'gay.'
 Tolerance of different beliefs/ religions – Different types of families/ anti-bullying.
