## Knowledge, Artists and Significant Works

The Anglo Saxons lived in small villages called settlements. Their houses were often made from wood and had thatched roofs (made of straw), narrow slits for windows and a door. Most houses only had one room, which was used for everything including sleeping, eating, cooking and entertaining.



The Anglo Saxons were highly skilled craftsmen and women. They carved crosses onto stone which can be found on or beside churches. These crosses were full of intricate carvings and would originally have been brightly painted and decorated with jewels and metal inserts.



## Key Vocabulary

<b>Sculpture</b>	The art of using different materials to create 3D structures.
<b>Join</b>	The place where two things are connected.
<b>Natural materials</b>	Organic materials that come from plants or animals e.g. wool or wood.
<b>Architecture</b>	The design of buildings by architects.
<b>Collage</b>	Art made from different pieces of paper, photos and other materials which are arranged and stuck down.
<b>Binding</b>	To tie, secure or fasten something with string, rope or wire.
